Next month, about 30, 000 runners will take to the streets of Boston, Massachusetts, for one of the world's oldest and most famous races, the Boston Marathon. Nearly half the runners in the 26.2-mile race will be women. But for most of the race's 120-year history, only men were officially allowed to compete.

A woman named Roberta "Bobbi" Gibb helped change that in 1966, when she secretly ran the marathon and finished ahead of most of the men. "Word went out around the world that a woman had done the impossible," says Gibb. "It changed the way men thought about women."

Gibb saw her first Boston Marathon in 1964, while running through her neighborhood. She was inspired* to run the race herself. For nearly two years, Gibb trained to build the energy and strength she'd need to finish. But when she sent in an application for the 1966 race, she was refused. At the time, the longest official races for women were only 1.5 miles. Many people didn't think women were physically able to run longer distances. Running a marathon was also seen as "unladylike".

But the 23-year-old Gibb refused to let go of her dream. She came up with a plan to run the race anyway. On April 19, she showed up at the marathon wearing her brother's shorts and a sweatshirt to hide the fact that she was a woman.

Gibb hid behind the trees near the starting line. When the race began, she jumped into the group. Shortly into the race, Gibb took off her sweatshirt. To her surprise, the crowd cheered when they realized she was a woman. Gibb finished the race in 3 hours and 21 minutes---faster than two thirds of the men runners.

Gibb opened the door for future women long-distance runners. In the years that followed she and other women ran in the Boston Marathon, even though the rules still prohibited* women from running in the race. Finally, in 1972, the marathon was officially opened to women.

Songs that make our hearts happy can make them stronger too, US researchers reported on Tuesday.

They found that when people listened to their favorite music, their blood vessels* opened up in much the same way as when they are laughing, or taking blood medicine.

"We have a pretty impressive effect," said Dr Michael Miller, director of preventive cardiology* at the University of Maryland Medical Center in Baltimore.

"Blood vessel diameter* improved," he said. "The vessel opened up pretty significantly*. You can see the vessels opening up with other activities such as exercise." A similar effect is seen with medicine such as statins.

When blood vessels open up more, blood moves more smoothly and is less likely to form the clots* that cause heart attacks* and strokes*. Dr Miller said, "We are not saying to stop your statins or not to exercise but rather to add this to a whole program of heart health."

Miller's team tested 10 healthy, non-smoking men and women, who were told to bring their favorite music. They spent half an hour listening to the music and half an hour listening to music which they said made them feel anxious, while the researchers did exams designed to show blood vessel function.

Compared to their normal measurements*, blood vessel diameter increased 26 percent on average when the volunteers heard their joyful music. Listening to music they disliked—in most cases in this group heavy metal—blood vessels narrowed* by six percent, Miller said.

Miller said he came up with the idea after discovering that laughter caused blood to move more smoothly. "I asked myself what other things make us feel really good, besides calories from dark chocolate of course. Music came to mind... It makes me feel really good," he said.

Most of the volunteers chose country music but Miller said the style is not so important rather than what pleases each person.
