Beijing Opera dates back to the year 1790. That year, four local opera troupes of Anhui Province came to Beijing on a 40 tour by order of the imperial court. The tour was a hit, and the troupes stayed. The artist picked out the tunes of the Hubei local opera and 41 the best of Kun Qu, Qin Qiang and Bang Zi and other local operas.

The performers' faces are 42 like masks. The different colors of the faces represent different characters. Red is for loyalty and courage. A typical red face is Guan Yu, a general of the period of the Three Kingdoms (220-280). He's well-known for his faithfulness to his Emperor, Liu Bei. The reddish purple face likewise shows a just and noble character---LianPo, 43. In the renowned play Jiang Xiang He, General Lian was proud and quarreled with the 44 minister to whom he was finally reconciled (和解).

The black face indicates a 45 and bold character. A good example is Bao Gong, the fearless and impartial judge of the Song Dynasty. White is for a trickster. A typical character is Cao Cao, the powerful and 46 prime minister in the time of the Three Kingdoms.

"Sheng, dan, jing, chou" are the terms for four different types of roles. "Sheng" is the positive male role, "dan" is the positive female role, "jing" is a supporting male role with striking character and "chou" is the clown. Every type had its facial makeup and costume. 47, Beijing Opera makes up an important part of Chinese culture.

Many a young person tells me he wants to be a writer. I always encourage them, but I explain that there's a big difference between "being a writer" and writing. In most cases, these individuals are dreaming of wealth and fame, not the long hours alone at a typewriter. "You've got to want to write," I say to them, "not want to be a writer."

The reality is that writing is a lonely, private and poor-paying affair. For every writer kissed by fortune there are thousands more whose longing is never rewarded. When I left a 20-year career in the US Coast Guard to become a freelance writer (自由撰稿者), I had no future at all. What I did have was a friend who found me a room in a New York apartment building. It didn't even matter that it was cold and had no bathroom. I immediately bought a used manual typewriter and felt like a genuine writer.

After a year or so, however, I still hadn't gotten a break and began to doubt myself: It was so hard to sell a story that barely made enough to eat. But I knew I wanted to write. I had dreamed about it for years. I wasn't going to be one of **those people who die wondering, what if I would keep putting my dream to the test---**even though it meant living with uncertainty and fear of failure. This is the **shadowland** of hope, and anyone with a dream must learn to live there.

People living on parts of the south coast of England face a serious problem. In 1993, the owners of a larger hotel and of several houses discovered, to their 69, that their gardens had disappeared overnight. The sea had eaten into the soft limestone (石灰岩) cliffs on which they had been built. 70 experts were studying the problem, the hotel and several houses disappeared altogether, sliding down the cliff and into the sea.

Erosion of the white cliffs along the south coast of England has always been a problem, but it has become more serious in recent years. Dozens of homes have had to be abandoned as the sea has crept farther and farther inland. Experts have studied the areas most affected and have drawn up a map for local people, 71 the year in which their homes will be swallowed up by the hungry sea.

Angry owners have called on the Government to erect sea defenses to protect their homes. Government surveyors have pointed out that in most cases, this is 72. Tremblay's performance on screen has made him one of the most promising actors in his age group. Hopefully, we will see a lot m 86 of him in the future on the silver screen or on TV.

"You'll have to put it back, son," he said. "Dad!" cried the boy.

"There'll be other fish," said his father. "Not as big as this one," cried the boy.

He looked around the lake. No other fishermen or boats were anywhere around in the moonlight. He looked at his father. Even though no one has seen them, nor could anyone ever know what time he caught the fish, the boy could tell by the clarity of his father's voice that the decision was not negotiable (可协商的). He slowly worked the hook out of the lip of the huge bass and lowered it into the black water. The creature swished its powerful body and disappeared. The boy suspected that he would never again see such a great fish.

That was 34 years ago. Today, the boy is a successful architect in New York City. His father's cabin is still there on the island in the middle of the lake. He takes his own son and daughters fishing from the same dock. And he was right. He has never again caught such a magnificent fish as the one he let go that night ago. But he does see that same fish---again and again---every time he comes up against a question of ethics (道德).

As his father taught him, ethics are simple matters of right and wrong. It is the only practice of ethics that is difficult. Do we do right when no one is looking? Do we refuse to take a shortcut to get the design in on time? Do you refuse to sneak a look at your desk mate's paper at the teacher is not looking?

We would if we were taught to put the fish back when we were young, for we would have learned the truth. The decision to do right lives fresh and fragrant in our memory. It is a story we probably tell our friends and grandchildren, not about how we had a chance to beat the system and took it, but about how we did the right thing and were forever strengthened.
